CEN/WS 'Emergency Response Plans' - announcement'

BACKGROUND

On 29 October 2021, CCMC received a proposal from ASRO for a CEN Workshop, entitled 'Structuring the emergency response plans of public safety agencies focusing on incidents such as CBRN and waste disposal plants emergencies'.

The objective of the standardization initiative is to develop a document that guides the officers of the public safety agencies on the development and structuring of the response plans that have to be activated during an emergency. Furthermore, guidance on the sharing of this information among the agencies that are involved in a situation will be provided. The guidance will be mainly focused on the emergency response plans that are related to the CBRN incidents and the management of situations related to waste disposal plants.

The Workshop kick-off meeting will be held on Thursday, 27 January 2022 as a web meeting. The workshop and kick-off meeting are announced on the CEN-CENELEC website:

3 Workshop objectives and scope

3.1 Background

Each EU country has their own processes and procedures for crisis management and disaster response. In the case of cross border crises, these different approaches may cause confusion or conflict among first responders and civil protection bodies. Even in the same country, the emergency response plans and operational procedures of the public safety agencies, usually, are not following a specific principle discouraging the sharing of operational information and the management of the common response activities. Developing a common structure of the emergency response plans and standardising procedures and interfaces across the EU is thus essential for facilitating cross-border and multi-agency collaboration, thereby helping to protect assets and save lives.

The EU-funded research project STRATEGY <https://strategy-project.eu/> has systematically identified and prioritised gaps in standardisation in crisis and disaster management and has compared them to the needs of end-users and to available opportunities across a broad spectrum of disaster management activities. All standardisation items to be developed in the course of the STRATEGY project will be fully tested and validated in tabletop exercises (TTXs) and full-scale exercises (FSXs).

Currently, there are very few standards referring to the definition and sharing of emergency response plans by public safety agencies. Only a few directives and guidelines exist, highlighting the importance of the response planning process, the sharing of the related information among the agencies and the development of the respective strategies

3.2 Scope

The objective of the standardization initiative is to develop a document that guides the officers of the public safety agencies on the development and structuring of the response plans that have to be activated during an emergency. Furthermore, guidance on the sharing of this information among the agencies that are involved in a situation will be provided. The guidance will be mainly focused on the emergency response plans that are related to the CBRN incidents and the management of situations related to waste disposal plants.

3.3 Related activities

The subject of the planned CWA is not at present the subject of a standard. However, there are committees, standards and/or other technical specifications that deal with related subjects and thus need to be taken into account - and involved, where necessary - during this Workshop:

- CEN/TC 391, 'Societal and Citizen Security'.

The EU-funded research project STRATEGY had asked and was granted the project liaison status in Technical Committee CEN/TC 391.

4 Workshop programme

4.1 General

The WS is expected to publish one single CWA, which will define the steps to be followed for structuring the emergency response plans of public safety agencies, focusing on incidents such as CBRN and waste disposal plants emergencies. The CWA will be drafted and published in English.

Due to the travel restrictions related to COVID-19, all meetings are intended to be both virtual and physical meetings, according to the possibilities. In all cases when a physical meeting will be set up, the possibility of virtual participation will be granted.

The program to reach the CEN-CENELEC Workshop Agreements entails the following steps:

The kick-off meeting is planned to take place on 2022-01-27, by teleconference. A draft of the Project Plan for public commenting will be published for 30 days.

A total of at least three Workshop meetings (kick-off meeting and Workshop meetings) and web conferences will be held, during which the content of the CWA will be presented, discussed, and approved.

In the context of the STRATEGY project, each CWA is planned to be evaluated by the end-users through two exercises, one TTX and one FSX exercise.

TTX is a table-top exercise (usually discussion-based), where end users are called to use and implement existing plans and procedures to take decisions according to a scenario.

FSX is a full-scale exercise, where end-users/stakeholders are called to respond to real situations on the field.

The purpose of these two exercises is to test and evaluate the content of the proposed CWA. The feedback that will be received will be integrated into the CWA.

5 Resource planning

ASRO will provide the Workshop Secretariat, subject to formal approval of the Project Plan at the kick-off meeting.

The Workshop will be financed within the framework of the EU-funded research project STRATEGY (Facilitating EU pre-Standardisation process Through streamlining and vAlidating inTeroperability in systems and procEdures involved in the crisis management cYcle). This project has received funding from the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement No 883520.

The copyright of the final CEN-CENELEC Workshop Agreement will be at CEN-CENELEC. The final document will include the following paragraph: "Results incorporated in this CEN Workshop Agreement received funding from the European Union's HORIZON 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement number 883520 (STRATEGY)".

Registration, as well as participation at the CEN-CENELEC Workshop, described here are free of charge. All costs related to the participation of interested parties in the Workshop's activities have to be borne by themselves.

6.2 Workshop responsibilities

The workshop chair will be formally appointed at the kick-off meeting by the parties present. The Workshop Chair is responsible for content management and any decision-making and voting procedures.

The list below covers the main tasks of the Workshop Chair. It is not intended to be exhaustive.

- Content related contact point for the Workshop
- Presides at Workshop meetings
- Ensures that the development of the CWA respects the principles and content of the adopted project plan
- Manages the consensus building process, decides when the Workshop participants have reached agreement on the final CWA, on the basis of the comments received
- Ensures due information exchange with the Workshop secretariat
- Represents the Workshop and its results to exterior

The Workshop Chair is supported by the Workshop secretariat.

The Workshop secretariat, provided by ASRO, shall ensure that CEN-CENELEC's rules of procedure, rules of presentation, and the principles governing the publication of CWA(s) have been observed. The Workshop secretariat is responsible for organising and leading the kick-off meeting, in consultation with the Workshop proposer. Scope of the proposed Workshop (planned area of application):

The planned Workshop will discuss specific recommendations on the development and structuring of the emergency response plans that are defined by the public safety agencies. A template that specifies the structure and the information that each emergency response plan has to define, will be proposed. The usage of this template will enable the digitalization of the emergency response plans and the sharing of information among the different agencies that are involved in a crisis situation. The planned CEN Workshop Agreement is intended to be used by planners (officers that are in charge of defining the emergency response plans of an agency) and the commanders of the public safety agencies. The planned CEN Workshop Agreement is not primary intended to be used by the first responders, as their scope is more focused on the implementation of the emergency response plans rather than the definition and sharing of these.

3 Security risk analysis

3.1 General

Security risk analysis is a process of identifying and analysing the main negative factors that may affect a standardization project's objectives. The following is targeted at secretariats of CEN/CENELEC Workshop Agreements (CWA) dealing with security issues. Its purpose is to help them identify and mitigate the risks associated with their project. It is structured around two main security threats that can affect the success of the work: major diverging interests among stakeholders and sensitive information.

3.2 Risk analysis on major diverging interest among stakeholders

Diverging interests among stakeholders can impede the process in reaching agreement on the CWA and even lead to failure to deliver the planned CWA. In order to identify and possibly mitigate the risks, the following questions should be reviewed:

- Is the planned CWA expected to have a major impact on the security policy/strategy of the core stakeholders?
- Does the scope of the CWA cover products or services with a clear dual-use purpose (i.e. which can be used for military purposes)?

3.3 Risk analysis on sensitive information

- In light of the scope of the CWA, is it likely that it may deal with sensitive information? If so, what is the information sensitivity level?
- Is there a need for a (non-)disclosure agreement?
- Is there any conflict of interest for stakeholders involved in the CEN/CENELEC Workshop, regarding especially the use they may make of any information they receive during the development of the CWA?
- What steps should be taken to manage information dissemination and storage (e.g. memory stick, emailing, storage) during the development process of the CWA?

Having regard the content of the future CWA, it is not likely that it will deal with sensitive information, a (non-) disclosure agreement is not needed and there is no conflict of interest for stakeholders involved in the CEN/CENELEC Workshop.
