SUBJECT

Creation of a new CEN Technical Committee on Small Craft

BACKGROUND

On 2019-05-03, CCMC received a proposal from SIS for the creation of a new CEN Technical Committee in the area of Small Craft (see Annex).

The new proposed technical committee will be responsible for maintaining the EN ISO collection supporting the Recreational Craft Directive (2013/53/EU) and transitional periods for harmonized standards.

The purpose of this proposal is not to establish a brand new field of activity, but to mainly:

- facilitate the maintenance of the EN ISO collection supporting the Recreational Craft Directive;
- transform the ISO standards into harmonized standards;
- support the ISO/TC 188 (Small Craft) officers and convenors with Annex ZA.

SIS consequently also proposed to disband CEN/BT WG 69 'Small craft' that has been carrying out these tasks so far.

By Resolution BT 65/2017, BT decided that the following criteria are to be met for acceptance of such a proposal for new work (in a new area):

- Vote according to Internal Regulations Part 2 clause 6.1.4;
- At least 5 members express commitment to participate.

As a consequence, BT Members are requested to state explicitly, by means of the commenting field provided in the BT-balloting tool, whether or not they are committed to participate in the work.

The scope for CEN/TC XXX will be the same as for the existing CEN/BTWG 69: to maintain the EN ISO collection supporting the Recreational Craft Directive and transitional periods for harmonized standards.

to use as far as possible the standards prepared by ISO/TC 188 'Small Craft' and to handle the proposed ISO documents in the framework of the Vienna Agreement. to facilitate the maintenance of the EN ISO collection supporting the Recreational Craft Directive;

to facilitate the development of 'European deliverable (EN, TS, CWA), in absence of consensus at global level or in absence of interest at ISO level.

In addition, it will support the participation of European expert in ISO/TC 188 standard development with the aim to support the ISO/TC 188 secretariat with Annex ZA.

- allocates the Secretariat of CEN/TC XXX to SIS;
- asks the new CEN/TC XXX to submit its final title and scope for BT approval after its first meeting.
- disbands CEN/BTWG 69 'Small craft'.

One future additional task should be to support the TC 188 Convenors with the Annex ZA. The focus for WG 69 has changed and in the future, it could mean more technical work. Therefore, the question if a working group or a technical committee is more appropriate has been raised.</p>
